As homework, all the children and staff who participated in the day were asked to complete a luggage tag with their comments. 83 luggage tags were completed and all were positive. Many contained more than one comment.

The feedback was captured as written. It was then sorted into the relevant elements of the day and corrected for spelling. Where the children's feedback was in a complex sentence or referred to different elements the relevant comments were separated to make the feedback coherent and meaningful.

It was particularly pleasing that so many children really enjoyed the day and said so. They also recognised and acknowledged the contribution of others for the work done.

Enlistment was the first activity of the school day, and all children had to sign up for the WW1day. 2 children commented that they enjoyed that part of the day.

The outdoor physical activity of marching, training, crawling under a cargo net etc. was very popular and 24 children gave very positive comments. Getting dirty was an important part of it. As well as an appreciation of the activity, it also prompted reflective comment:- "I really enjoyed the army training because it made you think about how little practice they had".

Enjoyment of the trench cake dominated the feedback regarding the home front and staff appreciated knowing about the alternative recipes using vinegar and bicarb.

15 children rated the first aid activities as fun. In the comments it was also clear that they recognised the nature of the injuries treated in the field, that soldiers gave first aid to each other and that it was a pressured environment.

The remote controlled replica tank was really appreciated as were the extensive range of artefacts brought by the Western Front Association. The replication of the sounds, in a dark room, clearly raised awareness of the impact of the volume and range of noises at the front and again prompted reflection – it made them think about the reality of war. 15 children commented on this activity.

The life of a soldier was rated by 10 children, particularly the costumes and the size and weight of a pack. The gun (with bayonet) was of particular interest, as was the details of the toilet arrangements on the front line.

The activity making poppies, and the rationale behind it was appreciated by 8 children.

Staff, visitors, volunteers and children dressed up on the day. Some were in authentic kit, others in replica costumes. Most of the children came in a wide range of outfits in keeping with the day. 4 children made specific comments valuing everyone "dressing up".

There were 25 very appreciative comments on the feedback tags. They ranged from a simple "Thank you XXX" to comments like "The best day ever" and "My favourite theme day while I have been at





primary". "Thank you for doing that. It was AMAZING". The children were saying thank you in general terms and thanking the staff and visitors for organising the day. Within the enjoyment of the day there was clearly a recognition of its purpose and a maturity of reflection e.g. "It made me realise they should never be forgotten" and "The soldiers were very brave of what they did"
