Robin Stapleford and Jules herself, portrayed scenes and memories from Bottesford and Muston's past, assisted by Circle Up Drama Group, the Ann Gibbons School of Dance, and a blessing from our Rector.

The sun shone, the temperature rose and a record crowd flocked to the Village Hall field for the Gala, where there was something for everyone. For the children, a Punch and Judy, an activity bus, a bouncy castle and donkey rides. There were many stalls, both on the field and in the village hall, and the refreshments were 'going like hot cakes'. Entertainment in the arena included the dog agility competition and maypole dancing by children from the Primary School. The Pirouette Dancing School pupils showed off their skills, as did the members of the Allington and Bottesford Karate School. The Vale of Belvoir Lions won the tug-of-war (all that practice at pulling strings); the Derbyshire Serenaders Marching Band led the procession and May Queen Millie Paine, with her attendants Hannah Dixon and Tegan Williams, rode in an open top Rolls Royce.

The Gala Committee was made up of many people who represented local organisations. These volunteers worked through the year and were able to buy much needed permanent equipment with two grants. A grant of £4,570 was awarded by The Big Lottery (Awards for All) and Melton Borough Council gave £500. Sponsors, too numerous to mention, contributed to make the event an undoubted success and thanks go to all who worked so hard to produce such a great Gala.

The Village Hall Committee was delighted to have raised over £1,000 for its funds. They couldn't have done this without the invaluable help of the members of the Bottesford WI who provided raffle and tombola prizes, cakes for the cake stall and helped serve refreshments throughout the long hot day. As a committee member said "We owe them a big, big thank you!"



He was born on the 9th October, 1942 and moved to Bottesford when he was 8 years old, with his brothers Peter, Lionel (Trout) and sister Doreen. He left school at 15 and worked for Len Palmer on Church Lane, then Aubrey Norris and on Ken Greasley's pig farm. In 1992 he went to work for Stan Taylor looking after the sheep, cattle and pigs. Although he retired in October 2007 at 65, in his words "I can't just sit at home all day!"

Gerald has a wife Jean, children Andrew, Vivienne, Emma and Philip and five grandchildren. He was brought up on Station Road with plenty of animals including chickens, cade lambs, goats, calves, dogs, cats and any other strays that came along.
