



Memorable community events commemorating those who served in the 1st World War

11 days of peace and remembrance were marked in Bottesford and Muston to commemorate the Centenary of the Armistice. It drew together many people of all ages and was organised as part of the nationwide 'Battle's Over' programme of commemoration.

These events were supported by the Parish Council in collaboration with many local organisations and individuals including: the Bottesford Guides, Brownies, Rainbows, Cubs and Beavers, the Hose and Harby Branch of the Royal British Legion, the churches of St Mary's Bottesford and St John the Baptist Muston, Bottesford Methodist Chapel, the Vale of Belvoir Lions, Bottesford Football Club, Bottesford Bowls Club, Pipe Major Billy James, cornet player Ian Holdsworth, Priory Belvoir Academy, Bottesford Primary School and the Bottesford Parish 1st World War Centenary Project.


Jesse Norman

Jesse Norman was the last casualty in the parish to be killed in action on 4th November 1918.

Jesse was born in Muston in 1880. His parents were Henry and Elizabeth Norman. When he left school, he became a fitter in a local quarry before becoming a farm worker. He enlisted in December 1915 with the Leicestershire Regiment. After his one leave in January 1918, he was 're-posted' to the King's Own Lancaster Regiment on his return to France.

Jesse suffered wounds to his face in May 1918. He was hospitalised in England but returned to France in October 1918 and was transferred to the Sherwood Foresters. He was killed on 4th November 1918 on the Landrecies to Marolles road, approaching the Sambre Canal.

Jesse Norman has no known grave but is remembered on the Vis-en-Artois Memorial and the War Memorial in Muston churchyard.



Other WW1 men from the parish

Most of the casualties from the parishes of Bottesford and Muston were buried and remembered in the country where they died.

However, three casualties of WW1 are buried in the churchyard. These men were badly wounded and died at home in Bottesford. Thomas Skinner died on 11th June 1918, Isaac Bonshor died on 11th December 1918, Frank Staines died on 26th October 1920.

The Bottesford Institute – a look back in time

The Bottesford Institute was established by the Duke of Rutland on the 8th August 1922 when he transferred the Belvoir Coffee House on Market Street to trustees as a club, reading room, library or institute for the use of all persons residing in the Parish of Bottesford. New trustees were appointed in 1944, and by the 1960's the premises were used as a Youth Club. In 1983 Mr Fred Holmes, who was the last serving trustee, died.



In 1988, it was decided, in conjunction with the Duke of Rutland and the Charity Commission, that Bottesford Parish Council be appointed as trustees of the Institute. A revised scheme was approved by the Charity Commission in March 1989 and the charitable objects of the Institute changed so the income would be applied *"For public charitable purposes for the benefit of the inhabitants of the Parish of Bottesford"*

The Belvoir Coffee House was sold. In 1995, the Bottesford Institute purchased the Old School from the Duke of Rutland at a price of £10,000.00. The Old School is currently part-leased to Leicestershire County Council who sublet to Bottesford Community Library.

Parish Council matters Barkestone Lane

The Parish Council have received complaints about vehicles using Barkestone Lane to access the A52. The use of the lane is dangerous and affects the quality of life of people who live on, walk on and use the schools on Barkestone Lane.

In addition, there are legal considerations.

"There is no access to the A52 at Barkestone Lane from the Bottesford End and there is no access to Bottesford from the A52 down Barkestone Lane towards Bottesford. The signage clearly states this from both ends."

There is a Traffic Regulation Order that prohibits driving, covering Barkestone Lane from the northern boundary of the A52 to the school entrance. There is no access to the A52 from the lane. Drivers will be committing a road traffic offence if they contravene this order and are liable to prosecution.

Enforcement action is being considered by the local police team. Volunteers are taking registration numbers of offending vehicles to support this.



Defibrillators

There are currently four defibrillators situated in Bottesford - the Old School, Pinfold Lane, Station Road and Belvoir Academy. There is also one at Muston, by the Old School Building.

There will soon be an additional defibrillator placed at the Warwick Flats on Granby Drive. On the agenda for the December Parish Council Meeting is the proposal to purchase a further two machines situated in Normanton and Easthorpe.

Henry's friends and family have set up a memorial fund for CALM and the Tomorrow Project - two charities which have suicide crisis lines and bereavement support services. 84 men die by suicide every week in the UK, which is 75% of all suicides. 

If your bin is cracked or broken within two years of the date of manufacture, MBC will replace it free of charge. If the bin is over two years old, there is a £37 charge inclusive of delivery. You can provide your own wheeled bins, providing each bin meets the EN840 standard and they match council bin specification.

As we have three bins of differing colours, MBC were asked if people could use one of the others if one was obsolete. The answer was no. Also, what if the lid is damaged? Are we allowed to put out this bin even though it would entice vermin?
