

I am a member of Ramblers and they are interested in claiming the route as a public right of way. If they can claim it, the route would be protected for the future. Draft Neighbourhood Plan out for consultation

The Bottesford Neighbourhood Plan Steering Group, in conjunction with the Parish Council, is pleased to announce the Bottesford Draft Neighbourhood Plan is now finalised and almost ready for submission to Melton Borough Council.

However, it is legally required to undertake a minimum 6-week consultation period and residents, stakeholders and consultees are being asked for their views. The Draft Plan is a detailed 130 page evidentially based document (as required under the Localism Act 2011) and can be viewed on the web site www.bottesfordparishneighbourhoodplan.org.uk/

The Draft Plan sets out policy framework across 19 policies that must be taken into account by Melton Borough Council when deciding planning applications in the Parish. These policies will shape the future of the village and they have been summarised in a questionnaire which is available at www.bottesfordparishneighbourhoodplan.org.uk/community-consultation.

The feedback will be analysed and summarised and may be used to alter those policies before submission to the Melton Borough Council. All responses will be considered and relevant issues or objections addressed.

Bottesford Library re-opened from 9.30am to 12.30pm on Saturday July 18th, after being closed through the lockdown, save for its popular pop-up bookstall located at the Methodist chapel on Devon Lane. The trustees and volunteers look forward to welcoming you.



Covid-19 safety measures for

hand sanitising and social distancing are in place. Only five library users will be permitted to enter at a time, and you will be asked for your name and contact number for contact tracing purposes.

The new opening provides for borrowing and returning library books, as well as offering donated books for sale. However, the public computers and the coffee machine remain out of bounds. The library will only be open on Saturday mornings, but additional opening times will be added in due course.

Bottesford Scout Group needs volunteer leaders and assistant leaders

Helene Priestley writes: 'I have volunteered as a Beaver Scout Leader for nearly 3 years. When my son was approaching the right age to join Beavers, I wanted him to join the Scout movement.

However, there hadn't been an active Beaver Colony in the village for several years. So with the help of Group Scout Leader Nick Rains, I set up a group on Tuesdays that meets for an hour every week during term time.

We meet at the Scout Hut on Albert Street but also get involved with local projects such as The Friendly Bench and Bee Friendly Garden. We have had sleepovers at The Deep aquarium in Hull and Space Centre in Leicester. We camp in tents, we invite people in to speak, such as the local PCSO. We try activities like grass sledging



and canoeing, and we work towards fun badges such as the Experiment Badge and Cycling Badge.

It is incredibly satisfying volunteering in a role that helps children to learn new skills, gain confidence, make new friends, and help them to stand on their own feet. I have also learnt a great deal.

Volunteers are needed to help with the Beavers (6-8 years), Cubs (8-10 years) and Scouts (10-14 years). You don't need to have been a Scout when you were younger. You don't need to know how to put up a tent. Full training will be given. It doesn't matter if you're young or old, whatever your skills, if you can help, we guarantee lots of fun." 2020 - a year of commemoration

This year has been a year of WW2 commemorations.

It is 80 years since the evacuation of British troops from Dunkirk in May/June 1940. It is 80 years since the RAF defeated the German Luftwaffe in the Battle of Britain in September 1940. In May, VE Day commemorated 75 years since the Allies signed a peace treaty with Germany and her allies. In August, VJ Day commemorated 75 years since WW2 ended, when Japan surrendered after atomic bombs were dropped on Hiroshima and Nagasaki.

The War Memorial in the church bears the names of WW2 casualties. Particularly poignant is that there are two casualties who died whilst they were prisoners of war in the Far East.

Colin Reeves, born in 1921, was the son of Frank Reeves, a gardener who lived and worked in the village. Colin worked at Beckingthorpe Farm but in 1941 he joined the RAF as an Aircraftsman 2^{nd} Class. He served in the Far East and



became a POW when the Japanese invaded Singapore and then Java. The International Red Cross reported that Colin Reeves died of dysentery and beriberi in a POW camp on Horoeko Island on September 9th 1943.

Private Walter Jesson, born in 1916, served in the 1st Battalion, Leicestershire Regiment. He was taken prisoner by the Japanese in 1944 and along with other POWs was being transported by ship when it came under fire. He was listed as missing on board ship. His name is remembered in the Singapore Memorial Cemetery in Keranji, Singapore.

David Jones, Tower Captain at St Mary's, tolled the tenor bell 75 times in commemoration of 75th anniversary of VJ Day at 11.10 am on the 15th August 2020.

Bottesford Parish A52 Update from Borough Councillor Don Pritchett

In September 2019, local councillors, together with our County Councillor and County Council Highways Officers, met with a Highways England (HE) manager to discuss the local A52 from the Lincolnshire to Nottinghamshire borders. HE are responsible for the A52, not the County Council.

We were informed that HE had an outline risk reduction scheme, subject to Government funding. The HE Manager explained that HE firstly reduce risks by design not by applying speed reduction to existing roads.



Councillors expressed an opinion

that speed reduction and lighting would be an improvement. This is supported by our local Police Officer. The record spend of £27 billion announced by HE in March 2020 for schemes to be completed by 2025 did not include a local A52 scheme.

Byron Rhodes our County Councillor has been told recently that HE still want to proceed with the scheme from Bingham to Barrowby but there is no funding at the moment. Also, there will not be any one-off work on redesigning the Belvoir Road Junction with the A52 in the near future.

To be a priority, the intended scheme or just local lighting and speed reduction requires Government support. Bottesford Melton Borough Council Ward Councillor Pru Chandler has written to our Member of Parliament (MP) to request lobbying for funding. Spotlight on Debbie Bass-Pickin

Debbie is a very respected and wellloved member of our community. She is shortly leaving the village to move north. The Village Voice asked Debbie for her reflections on living in the village. Her thoughts are below.

"I was born in Bottesford a few years ago! My grandfather and then my father were farmers in the Village. I went to Bottesford Primary school, both in the

old school (now the library). I vividly remember walking to the Baptist church on Queen street for our lunch every day, and we were the first cohort in the new school.

This was followed by Belvoir High, where I found my love for athletics, throwing the discus for county and training with the England squad (until my knees protested) and then Melton. I spent many years being part of BATS (Bottesford Amateur Dramatic Society), putting on numerous plays at the village hall.

I also worked for a good few years for Ken Greasley builders before I went to university to study Biology and Psychology and eventually turned my hand to teaching, spending 18 years in a number of schools in Grantham. I left teaching to help care for my father and was lucky enough to be offered the admin role at St Mary's church, which I have loved doing and have been heavily involved in lots of the church activities which the village loves and supports.

I started the Charity shop at Muston 6 years ago and I have worked in the Rutland Arms for many years through my late teens and twenties, seeing a lot of village life pass through the door, including the flood! I have spent the last 10 years living in Woolsthorpe but I am still heavily involved in Bottesford life through the church, secretary to the Garden Association and coming full circle to have the pleasure of serving on the Board of Governors, as Chair, at Bottesford Primary School for the last year.

Having spent over half a century in and around Bottesford, it will be very hard to say goodbye. But I am looking forward to a new chapter in my life in Morpeth and being close to my brother and nieces."



You will be asked to complete a voucher telling us the reason for your need. For example, low income, unemployment, benefit delays, wage delays, debt, ill health, homelessness. When you have completed the voucher with our onsite assessor, you will be given 3 days food for your family plus pet food and toiletries, and treats and maybe toys for your children.


